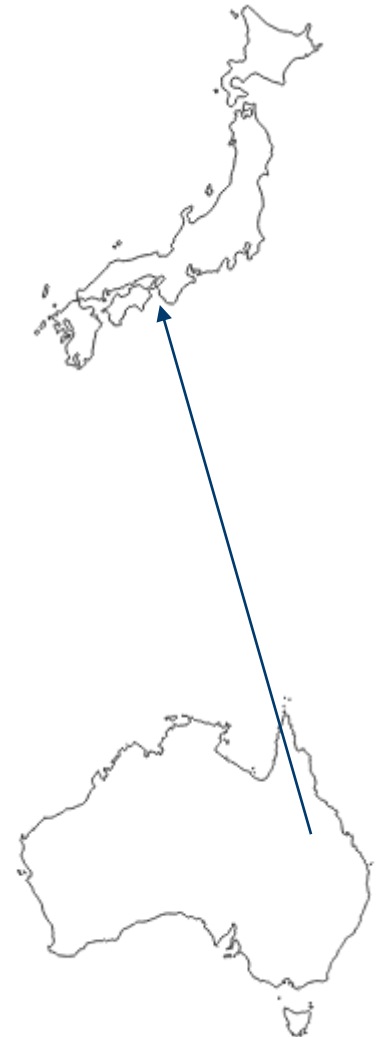

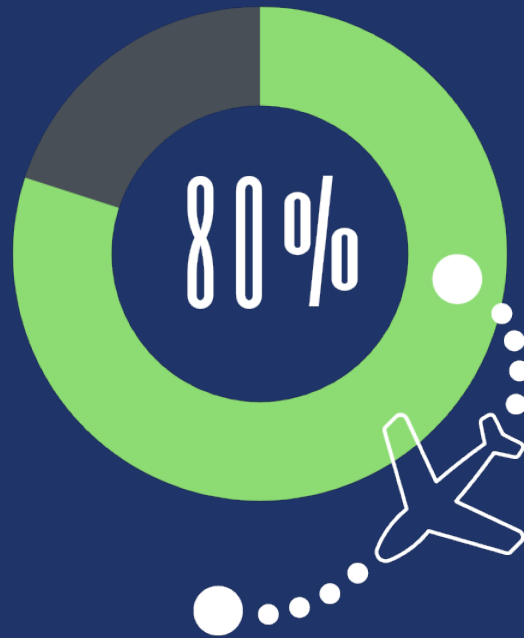

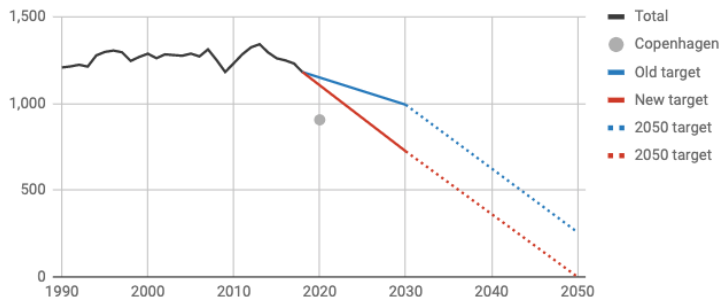
Australia will continue to export resources, including coal, based upon global demand.
